'Locomotion' Railway Museum at Shildon

This is a popular visiting place for our Members and we have had two visits recently. It's a lovely 35 minute drive to a mainly indoor display of steam trains, together with carriages and trucks. You are able to see the huge size of these impressive machines and to access the

Then there is a variety of interactive displays, where you can try your hand at shunting, or do some brass rubbings. You can also look at different model rail-

My, not so secret, Visit to Bletchley Park

For many years after World War Two, few people who hadn't worked there knew about Bletchley Park, because its activities were still on the secret list. It was only in the mid-70s that the in-



formation was declassified and Bletchley's role was revealed; in shortening the war by an estimated two years and saving countless thousands of lives. Nowadays, names such as Enigma, one of the German code machines, and Alan Turing, the most famous of the Park's codebreakers, are familiar to most people and as a result the Park had over 250,000 visitors in 2016. In May, this year, I visited Bletchley to see what it was all about.



Graham, the driver of the coach, parked up in the grounds and passed out our tickets and maps for Bletchley. There were eighteen huts with displays in, but not all were open because some displays were being updated.

Review of 'The Meg' Movie
